GENERAL REFERENCES

§ 8-1. Purpose.

It shall be the purpose of this Chapter 8 to provide an Auxiliary Police in accordance with NJ.S.A. App. A.9.1 et seq. and those executive orders from time to time entered by the Governor of the State of New Jersey.

§ 8-2. Appointments.

Appointments to the membership of the Auxiliary Police shall be upon recommendation to the Governor of the State of New Jersey or his designee by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Wood-Ridge from among candidates who have successfully

completed the minimal educational requirements prescribed by the State of New Jersey.

§ 8-3. Qualifications. [Amended 7-17-2007 by Ord. No. 2007-10]

Candidates shall, in addition to completing the requirements of the State of New Jersey, be residents of Bergen County, have attained the equivalency of a high school education and be at least 18 years of age.

§ 8-4. Exercise of powers and duties.

The powers and duties of the Auxiliary Police shall not be exercised except in the case of a declared emergency, as the same is defined at N.J.S.A. App. A.9.1 et seq.

§ 8-5. Supervision.

Unless otherwise provided by law, the Auxiliary Police shall be under the immediate supervision of the Chief of Police of the Borough of Wood-Ridge.

§ 8-6. Utilization in other than emergencies.

The Chief of Police of the Borough of Wood-Ridge shall be empowered to utilize the Auxiliary Police, in other than declared emergencies, when done as a part of continuing education and training, as provided by law.

§ 8-7. Manual of procedures.

The Chief of Police of the Borough of Wood-Ridge shall adopt a manual of standard operating procedures to be submitted to the State of New Jersey Police and the Governor of the State of New Jersey and such other persons and/or entities as may be provided by law.
