(1) Retail food establishments (off-premises consumption).

(a) Fees enumerated.

§ 256-3. License renewal. [Added 10-12-1994; amended 10-7-1999]

All licenses and permits shall be renewed by January 31. Licenses and permits not renewed by January 31 shall subject the licensee or permittee to a fine and penalties as may be fixed from time to time by the Board of Health or other applicable law.

§ 256-4. Violations and penalties. [Added 10-12-1994]

Any person, licensee or permittee who violates any provision of or order promulgated under this chapter or who shall not obtain the appropriate license or permit shall, upon conviction thereof, be liable to a penalty of not less than \$100 for each violation. Each day a particular violation continues shall constitute a separate offense.
