§ 37-1. Establishment. [Amended 2-18-1976 by Ord. No. 704; 8-20-1990 by Ord. No. 90-7]

- A. There shall be a Board of Health in the borough, consisting of seven (7) members appointed by the Mayor, with the advice and consent of the Council, for terms of three (3) years. The terms shall be so arranged that the terms of not more than three (3) members shall expire in any one (1) year. Appointments to fill vacancies shall be made in the same manner as original appointments, and all such appointments shall be for the unexpired term only.

- B. Two (2) alternate members shall also be appointed in the same manner as regular members. At the time of their appointment, alternate members shall be designated as "Alternate No. 1" and "Alternate No. 2."
- C. The terms of the alternate members shall be for two (2) years, except that the terms of the alternate members first appointed shall be two (2) years for Alternate No. 1 and one (1) year for Alternate No. 2, so that the term of not more than one (1) alternate member shall expire in any one (1) year. A vacancy occurring otherwise than by expiration of a term shall be filled by the appointing authority for the unexpired term only.

§ 37-2. Powers and duties.

The Board of Health shall have the power and authority to adopt ordinances relating to the protection of the health of borough residents, shall employ necessary personnel and fix their salaries and shall have under its jurisdiction the Bureau of Vital Statistics of the borough, the Health Officer and such other employees as are necessary to carry out its duties. The Board of Health shall have all the jurisdiction conferred upon boards of health by Title 26 of the New Jersey Statutes Annotated.
