## GENERAL REFERENCES

**§ 166-1. Return of borrowed articles upon notice.**

No person shall detain or fail to return any book or article borrowed from the Wood-Ridge Free Public Library, contrary to the rules and regulations of the library, after thirty (30) days have elapsed from the date of posting by certified mail, return receipt requested, of a notice demanding return thereof, addressed to the person at the last address furnished to the library.

**§ 166-2. Damage to library property.**

No person shall willfully or maliciously cut, tear, deface, disfigure, damage or destroy any book or other article or any part thereof, which is owned by or is in the custody of such library.

**§ 166-3. Furnishing false information.**

No person with intent to defraud shall register or furnish a false name or address, or use any card other than the one issued by the library to such person for the purpose of borrowing any book or article from the library.

**§ 166-4. Violations and penalties.<sup>1</sup>**

Any violation of the provisions of this chapter shall be punishable as provided in Chapter 1, General Provisions, Article II.
